# Practical experience with Remedy+ Cerazinc.



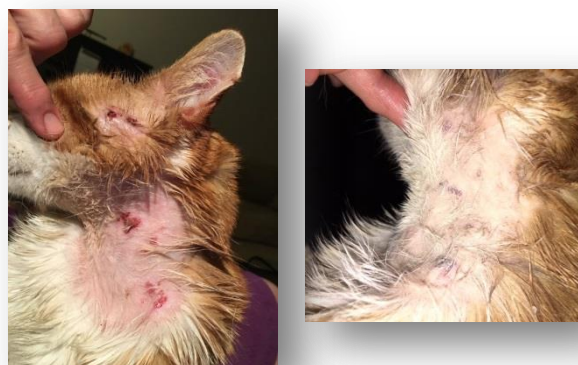
**CASE.** Diagnosis and treatment of an irritation spot with wounds on the neck. The irritation spot was located on the neck in the direction of the front paw. The cat's name is Bram.

**BRAM.** 16 years, tomcat, has well-regulated diabetes mellitus. Since a couple of weeks Bram started to show some balding spots in the neck. Recently this irritation started to show wounds and Bram is experiencing a lot of itch. The irritated area is expanding and the wounds are getting worse.

**EXAMINATION.** Trichograms are normal. Cytology of exudate under the crustae shows leukocytes and loose staphylococci, no intracellular bacteria.

**HOW.** Owner treated Bram by applying the HFL Remedy + Cerazinc to the yeast area twice a day. No additional products were used.

**RESULT.** After 5 days the wounds are healed and the itching is gone. After 2.5 months the fur is growing back and there is some fur to brush again.
